- The codeword for a change of frequency to 145.225 will be **RICHMOND**, Go to 145.225, Please observe radio silence and wait for instruction.
- All operators to wear hi visible tabards or jackets at all times. All checkpoint and vehicles to have signage. We need to be seen, this is a basic Health & Safety requirement.
- Please ensure all vehicles are parked in a secure location and not causing obstruction to local residents or other members of the public and has RAYNET signage.
- No member of RAYNET will transport or supervise any person under 18. All children under 18 must be accompanied by a member of the organiser's team.
- If you have any problems with your allocation please let the event controller know ASAP.
- All opening and closing Time are approximate and may be changed for operational reason.
- Tactical Call-sign to be used and the start of the contact and your call-sign at the end of the last over.
- No member should operate any radio or mobile phone equipment when they are driving vehicle unless it is fitted with a hands free microphone.

**An authorisation letter from the land owner giving us access rights for the event must be carried in the RAYNET Vehicles at all times. RAYNET Vehicles will not be taken to checkpoints three and four without this letter in the vehicle**



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- The radio net is an uncontrolled net or undirected net.
- All checkpoint can hear the checkpoint before and the checkpoint after then.
- CTCSS tone will be 82.5Hz on frequencies.
- All Checkpoints are issued with radio message forms (Yellow) which will be filled in by the timekeeper and then passed to you for transmission to the next checkpoint; this will be done at least every 20 minutes.
- The checkpoint staff will come to you for information. Please do not leave the radio to look for checkpoint staff. It is the responsibility of the checkpoint staff and any official to come to us not us to go looking for them.
- You will write any message you receive on the blue sheet provided by the timekeeper and hand this back to him the next time you see them. Do not leave the radio to look for them.
- All the checkpoint paper work will be issued by the Scouts on the day.
- No paper work will be sign or initialised by RAYNET
- Only the team number and time will be sent back to the previous checkpoint and not the individual numbers. (team 23 arrived at 13:50 at checkpoint 5)
- If you have any incident, it is the responsibility of the organiser's controller to make any decision on any incidents, not us or the checkpoint staff.
- It is the responsibility of the organiser's controller to know the whereabouts of the main members of his organisation.
- No one will use this radio system only Licensed Amateurs. If you are approached by any one who asks to send a message, find out who they are first.
- We do not pass messages for walkers or supporters.
- We will not provide information to supporters about their team.
- When the checkpoint staff leave the checkpoint then the checkpoint is closed. We are there to pass messages, not to cover any short comings in the organiser health and safety policies. You may be asked to stop to maintain comms with our sweep.
